# Twinkle

## 24" x 24"

### Pillow or Wall Hanging

This is a free bonus pattern using the Twinkle pattern to make a pillow or wall hanging.

#### **Cutting for all 10 blocks:**

Background (for all blocks):

- **A** 40 – 2" squares
- **B** 40 – 2" x 3 ½"
- **E** 4 – 6 ½" squares

Star #1 (4 stars):

- **C** 32 – 2" squares
- **D** 4 – 3 ½" squares

Star #2 (2 stars):

- **C** 16 – 2" squares
- **D** 2 – 3 ½" squares

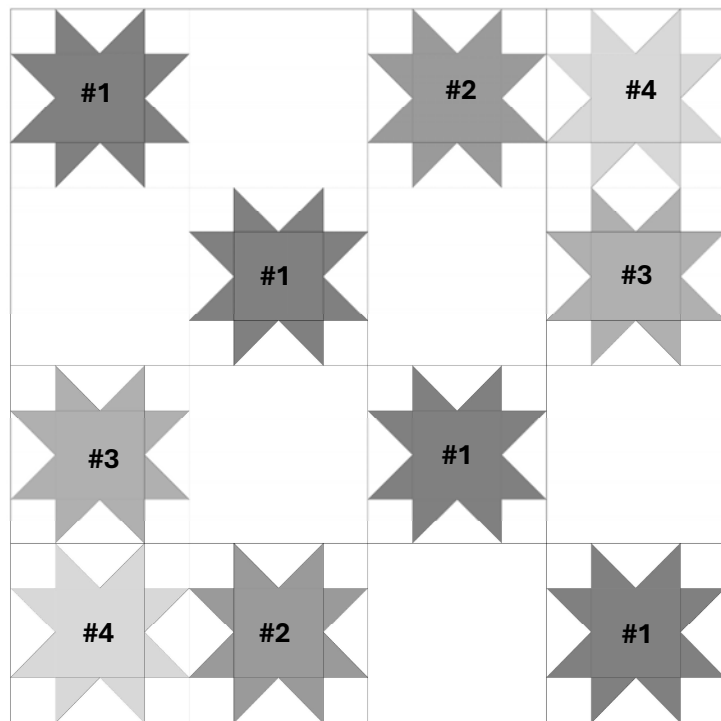
Star #3 (2 stars):

- **C** 16 – 2" squares
- **D** 2 – 3 ½" squares

Star #4 (2 stars):

- **C** 16 – 2" squares
- **D** 2 – 3 ½" squares Lay

Binding: 3 – 2 ½" x WOF strips



Follow directions on pages 3 and 4 to

construct the stars. Lay out quilt, row by row using **E** squares and pieced stars. Alternate pressing each row, one to the left and the next to the right, and so on. Stich rows together, pressing all rows one direction.

#### **Wall hanging:**

Quilt as desired. Bind with 3 strips of 2 ½" x WOF using your favorite method.

#### **Pillow:**

I really like the look of quilted and bound pillows. It just gives your pillows that finished look. Quilt the top using the muslin as backing. Trim off extra batting and backing. If making the pillow, you will need a 24" pillow form.

From backing fabric cut 2 – 24 ½” x 16 ½” pieces. Hem one long side of each panel. These panels will make an envelope back to your pillow. This way you can easily slip out the pillow form and wash your quilted pillow cover as needed. Place your quilted top face down. Lay one backing panel, wrong side down, on pillow top making sure the hemmed edge is towards the middle. Now place the second backing panel, wrong side down, on other side of pillow top. Be sure to overlap your hemmed edges of backing panel in the middle. Baste around the edge with a scant ¼” seam allowance. Bind with 3 strips of 2 ½” x WOF using your favorite method. You may need to trim down your backing panels a little since your quilt top will shrink a little, depending on how tightly quilted it is. Stuff your pillow form into your new pillow cover and enjoy!
